FROM THE DESK of our Parish Priest

Dear Friends.

The first quarter of 2019 has been a "happening" time for our parish on many fronts, making this issue of our parish bulletin alive and interesting. Thank you to those who sent in reports so that all of us can be enriched and learn from one another.

On March 17th and 24th the Election committee organised the commissioning of SCC Co-ordinators and Animators. There was "Annointing with Holy Oil" for the new, and returning, Co-ordinators, and a "Laying-On of Hands" for Animators, while the whole congregation fervently prayed for gift of the Spirit; A deeply moving experience, which will surely flow over into all family clusters, and renew our whole parish from within.

At this special time, when we need to strengthen intercessory prayer for our country, it is heartening to read that our communities have indeed been praying. Besides pilgrimage "Stations of the Cross", there were Lenten Missions in Marathi, Konkani, Tamil and English, (three days each), the JERICHO CROSS mini nightvigil, and anniversary celebrations for our prayer groups - ZION: twenty-one years, DAYA SAGAR PRARTHNA SANGH: seven years, SHALOM YOUTH: eleven years, and one year for the fledgling CORNERSTONE.

We remember how GOD'S HAND WAS STAYED WHEN MOSES PRAYED; and that Jericho's high, thick, strong, double-walls crumbled when the people shouted with one loud voice to Yahweh. And we are encouraged to persevere in prayer in our day too.

Finally, CONGRATULATIONS! First, to the thirty RCIA candidates and those who prepared them for Baptism; may they always continue to be graced as when they shared their first testimonies. We also commend the Marathi choir and

conductor, Tony Nigrel, for winning a prize for the second year in succession at the Archdiocesan competition.

Two of our parishioners speak of life-changing experiences after attending special courses organised by the Archdiocese - Stanley Fernandez, the **Institute for Ministry of Faith Enrichment** (**IMFE**) and Percy Kinny, the **Training of Trainers** (**TOT**); while Hema Gonsalves, Veronica and Helen Kinny have completed the **Ministry of the Word (MOW)** in Marathi, and Mr. Joseph D'Silva graduated in the **Basics of Inter-Religious Dialogue (BIRD)**.

They encourage all parishioners to avail themselves of these opportunities too.

I am reminded of a little girl whose heart was set on a cream cake for her grandfather on his birthday, but her mother could not afford it. Seeing the child's disappointment, a passer-by buys the cake for her. When the mother objects, the man tells his own story of how when he was seven, a totally unknown gentleman whom he never met again, came to his rescue, just as he is doing for the little girl now. Asked for his address, he hands a note to the little one.

When they get home, the child explains: "someone paid for it ... he gave me this note ... The grandfather opens it and reads ... *A simple act of caring creates an endless ripple*. ... and his mind goes back to a little boy aged 7 for whom he had bought a cake and written a similar note many years earlier.

Friends, this issue of our parish bulletin reverberates with activities which are bound to spill over, since caring and sharing have a ripple effect. Small beginnings create waves.

CELEBRATING Saints



St. Anselm.

Bishop and Doctor (1033 - 1109)

Indifferent toward religion as a young man, Anselm became one of the Church's greatest theologians and leaders. He received the title "Father of Scholasticism" for his attempt to analyze and illumine the truths of faith through the aid of reason.

A monk of the monastery of Bec in Normandy, Anselm was considered an original and independent thinker. His best known work is the book: "Why God Became Man".

He became Archbishop of Canterbury, England, in 1093, and started reforms in the Church. Oppositions from the Kings of England forced him into exile.

His care and concern extended to the very poorest of the poor and he was the first in the Church to oppose the slave trade. Anselm obtained from the National Council at Westminster, the passing of a resolution prohibiting the sale of human beings. Though personally a mild and gentle man and a lover of peace, he would not back off from conflict and persecution when principles were at stake.



St. Philip Neri. Priest (1515 - 1595)

Philip Neri was born in Florence in 1515 and educated by the Dominicans. He experienced conversion at the age of 18 and left for Rome where he began to work with young men among whom he fostered Christian life and formed an association for the poor and the sick.

Ordained to the priesthood in 1551, he founded the Oratory where spiritual reading, singing, and works of charity were practiced. He excelled in love of neighbour and in evangelical simplicity along with a joyous service to God. He died at the age of 80; much loved and respected, he is still known as the "Apostle of Rome".



St. Anthony Of Padua Priest & Doctor (1195 - 1231)

The gospel call to leave everything and follow Christ was the rule of Anthony's life. Over and over again, God called him to something new in his plan. Every time Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrifice to serve his Lord Jesus more perfectly.

He was born in Lisbon, Portugal, and initially joined the Canons Regular of St. Augustine, but, shortly after ordination to the priesthood, transferred to the Friars Minor to devote himself to spreading the faith among the African peoples.

He had his greatest success, however, preaching in France and Italy and converting heretics. He was the first member of his Order to teach theology to his brethren. His sermons are notable for their learning and gentleness.

He died in Padua in 1231, was canonized within a year and named Doctor of the Church in 1946.

MATTERS That Matter

Are you Scripture - Literate?



The Archdiocese designates various Sundays during the liturgical year to remind the Faithful about key issues. We are familiar with Justice Sunday, Vocation Sunday, etc., but the Sunday before Ash Wednesday is chosen as Bible Sunday to remind us that "everything in Christianity is founded on

God's word, as contained in the Bible!"

To help us benefit more from the annual celebration of Bible Sunday, Cardinal Oswald Gracias asked that the Bible Novena to be prayed at every Mass from Feb 22 to March 3, 2019.

This year's theme "GOD'S WORD IS OUR DAILY FOOD," reminds us that receiving "spirit and life" from the Eucharistic Jesus in communion is not enough...a Catholic must seek "spirit and life" from the Bible.

The Second Vatican Council assures us about the efficacy of regular devotional reading of scripture: "Just as from constant attendance at the Eucharistic mystery, a new impulse of spiritual life may be expected from increased veneration of the word of God" (Dei Verbum, nn.21, 26).

God's ways of inspiring us to respect the word of God are limitless.

Read this inspiring testimony of Fireman Sam

When I was a member of the Fire Department, we were summoned to a house fire, located in the bedroom, which had ravaged most of the woodwork and bed linen before we could extinguish it.

After putting out the fire, we perform a cleanup of all burned materials, known in fireman's lingo as 'salvage'. As I looked around the room, I noticed that the piano, lying in one corner, was so intensely hot that the keys on the piano had melted into one big lump.

As I probed the ravaged stuff, I chanced upon a book only to discover that it was a family Bible. As I dusted it off, I noticed that the pages had not a trace of burn or soot. This was the only article to survive the fire, undamaged. When I handed it over to the lady of the house, she saw the consternation in my eyes and asked me: "Do you read the word of God?" Shamefully, I said: "No...I once was a practising Catholic but my life has been on a ride downhill."

The lady with a tender smile said: "Can I gift this Bible to you as a 'Thank You' gesture for your efforts to douse the fires? But promise me that you will read a short passage every day." And she flagged John 14:27 in the Bible which said: "I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid."

And the rest is history. "My life has taken on a new meaning since then"! So much for the power of God's word!

Pope Francis constantly reminds us to read the Gospel daily.

He says: "The Scriptures are nutrients of the soul, and the source of grace, just like the sacraments!" Indeed, "God's word is our daily food," with an inbuilt power to nourish and transform us into better disciples of Jesus Christ.

In keeping with the Archdiocesan call to organize entertaining bible skits and quizzes, the Bible Cell of our Parish organized a Bible Quiz based on the 'Acts of the Apostles' to foster a personal biblical spirituality. His face is completely shrouded, his hands obscured. A closer glance reveals the deep wounds afflicting his feet.

This is no ordinary person. It is the "Homeless Jesus".

The "Homeless Jesus" is a bronze statue masterfully designed by a Canadian artist and devout Catholic named Timothy Schmalz. Stationed in cities across the world, it evokes several '911' calls wherever it goes. Blessed by the Pope, it's most prominent placement is in Rome outside the Papal Office of Charities.

The depiction of Christ as a nameless, powerless and homeless stranger is indeed provoking and challenging. It visually translates one of the most essential and powerful ideas of the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 25 – 'Truly I say to you, whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do it unto Me.'

In this fast-paced, ever-changing, forever-busy world, identifying the poor and needy is quite a challenge. How then can we reach out in love and service? Perhaps the answer lies in unplugging our head-phones, turning down the volume of our self-centred thoughts and embracing the real world that surrounds us. Initially, we may find it ugly, boring and poor but poverty and grossness was not made by God. You and I created it when we ignored and refused to share our blessings with others, as also when we selfishly hoarded and consumed the best, caring not about the rest whose basic needs, whether physical or mental, are rarely met.

Nay, one cannot sit back in an armchair watching, procrastinating and awaiting a better tomorrow. Like St. Vincent de Paul and his Society we need to get up and help with enthusiasm and simplicity. But is 'reaching out' restricted to 'feeding the hungry, quenching the thirsty and clothing the naked?'

Mother Teresa, the saint of India, alleges, 'We think sometimes that poverty is only being hungry, naked and homeless. The poverty of being unloved, unwanted and uncared for is the greatest poverty. We must start in our own homes to remedy this kind of poverty.'

Let's answer these propelling questions for ourselves:

Addicted to my gadgets and my 'social' media life, am I isolating the ones nearest and dearest to me? Have I forgotten the joy of sharing a family meal and chatting away about the events of the day? Have I shut the door of my heart, if not that of my room on others, especially those around me seeking a word of encouragement, a smile of strength or an embrace of hope?

During this Holy Week, and the season of Easter which follows, let's turn around and notice the "Homeless Jesus" standing at the door of our hearts eagerly waiting to come in!

......Separated By Differences; Made One In Christ



The Small Christian Community (SCC) is the most basic and precious entity of the Church. When we live in a community, it does not imply mere cohabitation, but

cooperation, coordination and collaboration. In Christ's body, we are different parts with different strengths and shortcomings. In order to create a community that cares and shares, we need to be aware of our gifts, and then use them effectively to help others. As we use our strengths to help others' weaknesses, we in turn, are helped in our weaknesses through their strength.

Some of the most widespread issues we are confronted with, in our communities today, are poverty, complacency and loneliness. Poverty is not to be misunderstood as financial poverty alone, but spiritual and emotional as well. Complacency exists when people feel that there is always someone else to do what they could do themselves – whether it's in church or in society. Many may not want to lift a finger or dirty their hands, lest they get involved. And of course, even with the latest communication gadgets, people are becoming more and more lonely, especially the senior citizens. And these issues are just the tip of the iceberg.

So here is where we can capitalise on the fact that all of us need each other. It is important for us to create avenues and initiatives of outreach. The small Christian community gathers around those who are struggling with poverty, whether financial or emotional. Replicating Acts 2:42 onwards, the SCCs are vantage points for people to share and care, not from a sympathetic but an empathetic angle. Remember St. Mother Teresa who said that not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love.

The small Christian community is a wonderful place for talent to be scouted and for people to express themselves, so that complacency may give way to involvement. And where there are elderly and lonely people, members of the SCCs can always make themselves available with their time and resources to give the alienated a sense of belonging.

Living in a community is like being a part of a never-ending circle of life, where everyone draws their strength from each other, and where we, as a whole, draw our strength from Christ and the Church. This is well summed up in the following extract from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

'In Christian usage, the word "church" designates the liturgical assembly, but also the local community or the whole universal community of believers. These three meanings are inseparable. "The Church" is the People that God gathers in the whole world. She exists in local communities and is made real as a liturgical, above all a Eucharistic, assembly. She draws her life from the word and the Body of Christ and so, herself, becomes Christ's body.' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 752)

The Jericho Cross visits our parish



No, the Jericho Cross did not come from Jericho as most of us surmised. Its history and significance were explained by Brother Saby at the mini Night vigil held on March 26th.

In May 2018, their prayer group was inspired to follow the instructions in Ch. 6 of the Book of Joshua, when God promised that the battle of Jericho would be won.

These instructions were simple and direct:

See;

Be Silent; Sleep (don't worry); Surround (once a day for six days, and seven times on the seventh day); Shout, when commanded to do so. Joshua directed the people to believe and follow strictly in faith, and, on the seventh day, the 20' high, 8' thick, double walls of Jericho completely crumbled.

Struck by the parallels with the present situation in our country, they constructed as many crosses as there are dioceses in India and obtained permission to organise "Jericho Cross" pilgrimages from one Church to another in every diocese. The aim was to pray for a peaceful conduct of the forthcoming elections and for good governance in the country.

I attended the semi Night vigil organised by the Cornerstone Prayer group in our parish. During the Praise and Worship conducted by Brother Saby we raised our voices and prayed ardently for India, her people and all in authority. A reminder of the walls we have to break down... and what better time than the period of Lent? I was deeply touched by his personal testimony.

We then commenced the Jericho March - a prayer walk by the congregation encircling the Chruch 7 times, especially asking God to protect our country, and also for many other intentions.

I deeply appreciate the team who took care of the beautiful décor. Thanks to the Cornerstone for enabling us to be a part of this novel, soul-stirring experience.

INSTITUTE FOR MINISTRY OF FAITH ENRICHMENT



IMFE is a self-challenging and fulfilling eight week-end journey, conducted over a year, by the Archdiocese of Bombay for deepening whichever Ministry one is involved with. My experience began in July 2018 & ended on graduating in March 2019 for the Inter-Religious Dialogue Ministry.

The course enhanced our understanding through group discussions, personal assignments and various other methods of sharing. It helped us plan & practice our ministry in collaboration with the parish priest, the local parish ministry team, as well as the various Commission Heads thus ensuring a commonality of purpose across the Local Churches, the Archdiocese & the Universal Church.

The curriculum was systematic & progressive with various topics taught by experts. The session on Theology & Ministry focused on the history, mystery and purpose of the Church. What attracted my attention was that the Church has always worked in collegiality and not in isolation.

The session on Sociology & Ministry encouraged us to analyse, research and study

the proofs. The importance and acceptance of 'reasoning' was indeed fascinating.

The session on Anthropology & Ministry helped me realize the value of culture to human beings in the Christian Worldview.

The Psycho-Spiritual Dimension of Ministry helped us express from the depths of our hearts & minds, enhancing team-spirit.

The openness of the Church to modern management methods through the inclusion of corporate management techniques in Managing the Ministry by asking the right questions, finding the right answers, then revisiting those answers on a regular basis.

The mission of the Church to reach out to people of other religious beliefs was brought out very beautifully through the Pluri-Religious Ministry which emphasized that every human being is made in God's likeness & therefore it is our duty to dialogue with others to reach a common understanding of the truth.

However, we learned much more than was taught directly in the curriculum - about life, spiritualiity and the web of relationships; these need to be experienced rather than converyed in a short article.

I now belong to a new family "IMFEians" who realise that "God doesn't CALL the QUALIFIED, He QUALIFIES the CALLED!" Just allow Him to use you....Thanks & Praise be to God.

Training of Trainers (TOT) course

Adults generally question the need for training. I too shared a similar opinion until someone coaxed me to undertake the TOT course for which I am sincerely grateful. It has enhanced my knowledge and skills, unleashing hithertounexplored potential.

The **"Training of Trainers**" certificate programme organised by the Laity Training Centre affiliated to the Archdiocese of Bombay includes 7 intensive sessions conducted on one Sunday a month by a highly experienced and efficient team including Fr. Patrick D'mello, Thomas Lobo and Michael Rodrigues.

When I took up the TOT training course, my objective was to understand how a good workshop should be conducted. The TOT course went far beyond that, however, making me realise that there is more to training the trainer than can be at first perceived.

The course is well-designed focussing primarily on developing capacity and skills to handle a training workshop with confidence and poise both at the Pastoral and Corporate level. Each session dealt with the finer details of training and helped me emerge as a better trainer.

The main highlight of this training programme is the mentor-supervised practical training and presentation sessions. Through the presentations, trainees demonstrate the learnings absorbed from the input sessions by presenting a topic they have researched. The mentors then provide constructive feedback including tips on improving inadequacies.

I highly recommend this course to any parishioner seeking to hone their skills and leadership roles, especially the Animators and Coordinators of our SCCs. It is more than

100% worth the nominal fee and the time you would spend.

मला वाटलं तु मूळची ख्रिस्ती आहेस म्हणून तुझ्या चेहऱ्यावरुन आणि देहबोलीवरुन बिल्कुल समजत नाही की तु बाप्तिस्मा (कन्हवर्टेड) स्वीकारलेली आहेस.

होय, मी लग्नानंतर बाप्तिस्मा स्वीकारला.

ओह ! ग्रेट! किती मिसळलीस ग या समाजात. अभिनंदन ! अभिनंदन!

दयासागर प्रार्थना संघातर्फे प्रौढ बाप्तिस्मा स्वीकारलेल्या श्रद्धावंतांचा मेळावा १४ फेब्रुवारीला चॅपलच्या आवारात साजरा झाला. जवळ जवळ ३० बाप्तिस्मा स्वीकारलेल्या उमेदवारांनी यामध्ये सहभाग घेतला होता. माझी साक्ष व अनुभव देताना सि. डॅफनी यांच्या बरोबर झालेला वरील संवाद. मी मूळची हिंदू धर्मीय, मराठी भाषिक कुटुंबात वाढलेली. घरातले वातारण पूर्णपणे पारंपारिक व रुढीप्रिय अशा धार्मिक चालीरीतींचे.

आंतरधर्मीय विवाह असल्यामुळे घरच्यांचा सुरुवातीला टोकाचा विरोध झाला. लग्नानंतर मी खारोडी गावात आले भिन्न प्रकृतीच्या, संस्कृतीच्या समाजाबरोबर राहायचं म्हणजे त्यांच्या पद्धती, धर्म, भाषा यांना समजून घेऊन आत्मसात करायचं ठरवलं. आपण उचलेलं पाऊल यशस्वीपणे व आनंदाने पुढे न्यायचं म्हटलं तर 'मी' पणाचा त्याग करावाच लागतो. कौटुंबिक आनंदापुढे संस्कृती, धर्म, रुढी ह्यांचा दुराभिमान सोडला तरच तुम्ही वैवाहिक जीवनात टिकून राह शकता.

सुरुवातीच्या काळात मी केवळ कुटुंबाच्या गरजेला प्राधान्य दिलं. तोपर्यंत येथील समाजाच्या लग्न, बाप्तिस्मा, दृढीकरण, अंत्यसंस्कार आदि प्रसंगांच्या चालीरीती कळून आल्या. शेजारी व गावपरिवारातील लोकांनी सहजपणे मला आपलंसं केलं, यामुळे मनात कधीही शंका, संशय, भीती वा लाज या भावना आल्याच नाहीत.

कालांतराने मूलगामी समाजात प्रेरक म्हणून सहभाग घेतला. महिला सोडॅलिटी, कुटुंब समिती या मध्ये सक्रीयरित्या कार्य करण्याचा अनुभव काही वेगळाच होता. समन्वयक (को-ऑ

र्डिनेटर) म्हणून गळ्यात माळ पडल्यावर धर्मग्राम पाळकीय मंडळावर रुजू झाले. (पॅरीश कौन्सिल) दयासागर प्रार्थनासभा, प्रभूशब्दांचे वाचन यामुळे आत्मविश्वास वाढायला मदत झाली.

आज बऱ्याचशा कौटुंबिक जबाबदाऱ्या पार पडल्या असून सामाजिक कार्यात सहभागाची संधी मिळाल्याबद्दल एका बेगळ्याच आत्मिक आनंदाची तृप्ती वाटत आहे. याचं सारं श्रेय मी माझ्या कुटुंबाला हाथ आणि साथ देणाऱ्या येथील गावपरिवाराला व चर्चमधील मोकळ्या वातावरणाला देत आहे. अर्थात परमेश्वराप्रति मी कायम कृतज्ञ राहन त्याची स्तुती करेन.

प्राथमिक बायबल वर्ग २ रे अधिवेशन

मुक्तीसागर प्रबोधन केंद्र, उत्तन यांच्या समन्वयाने अलिबाग येथे भरविण्यात आलेल्या प्राथमिक बायबल वर्गाच्या शिबीरातील दुसऱ्या अधिवेशनाचा वृत्तांत. **फा. अजित तेलीस** यांनी '**बायबल व सेवाकार्य**' या विषयावर या अधिवेशनामध्ये मार्गदर्शन केले.

''मी सेवा करुन घेण्यासाठी आलो नाही तर सेवा करण्यासाठी आलेलो आहे.''

ख्रिस्ताने उच्चारलेले हे उद्गार मत्तय२०:२८ यामधील आहेत.

ख्रिस्तसभेच्या मिशन कार्याचा पाया ह्या वचनावर आधारित आहे. ह्या वाक्याला कें द्रस्थानी ठेवून कॅथलिक चर्चने आपल्या कार्याचा विस्तार केला आहे. सेवा म्हणजे काय? ह्यविषयी बोलताना फा. तेलीस यांनी निस्वार्थीपणे दुसऱ्या व्यक्तीच्या विकासासाठी केलेले कार्य म्हणजे सेवा अशी सरळसोपी मांडणी केली.

बायबलमध्ये सेवेसाठी अनेक समानार्थी शब्द वापरल्याचे उदाहरणासहित स्पष्टीकरण केले.

बायबलमधील सेवा ही एकाच स्तरावरील आहे. मग ती सेवा शेतातील असो अथवा मंदिरातील. चर्च मध्ये तीन प्रकारच्या सेवा प्राधान्याने राबविल्या जातात त्या म्हणजे, धार्मिक, सामाजिक व शैक्षणिक.

बायबलमधील सेवेसाठी वापरलेले शब्द :

९) अबोधा (ABODHA) या शब्दाचा अर्थ काम करणे, कष्ट करणे, गुलाम होऊन काम करणे – निर्गम १:१४; २७:१९ गणना ७:९;८:२६ व १ इतिहास २६:३०

- अभात (ABHATH) हा शब्द धार्मिक सेवेसाठी वापरण्यात आला आहे. गणना ८:१५; ८:२३ यिर्मया २२:१३
- ३) शराथ (SHARTH) म्हणजे हजर असणे. निर्गम ३५:१९
- ४) त्साभा (TSABHA) म्हणजे कठीण परिस्थितीला सामोरे जाणे (उदा. युद्ध) ह्या शब्दाचा अर्थ सुद्धा सेवा या शब्दाशी मिळता जुळता आहे. जुन्या करारात हा शब्द सात वेळा उल्लेखिलेला आहे. गणना ४:३०; ३५, ३९, ४३ व ८:२४
- ५) डीयाकोलीया (DIAKONIA) म्हणजे भौतिक सेवा २ करिंथकरास ११:८, रोमकरांस पत्र १५:३१ व प्रकटीकरण २:१९
- ६) ड्यूलेवो (DOULEVO) म्हणजे गुलाम होणे. गलतीकरांस
 ४:१८, शफिसिकरांस ६:७, १ तिमिथी ६:२
- ७) लेट्रीया (LATERIA) म्हणजे देवाची स्तुती आराधना करणे.
 योहान १६:३, रोमकरांस पत्र १:४; १२:१, इब्रीलोकांस पत्र ९:१; ६
- ८) लिटराझिया (LEITOURGIA) म्हणजे उपासना करणे, आज्ञा पाळणे. २ करिंथकरांस ९:१२, फिलिपैकरांस २:१७,३०

देवाने सर्वप्रथम सेवेला सुरुवात करुन आपल्यासमोर आदर्श निर्माण केला. उदा. सृष्टीची निर्मिती, तांबडा समुद्र पार करण्यासाठी सहकार्य करणे.

नवा करार हा सेवेचा जणू ग्रंथच आहे. येशूने केलेले चमत्कार, शिकवण हे सर्व सेवेमध्ये मोडत आहे. तीच परंपरा आपण आजतागायत चालू ठेवली आहे.

उपवासकालीन मिशन

उपवासकाळ म्हणजे आध्यामिक मेजवानीचा काळ. या काळात सर्वसाधारणपणे बाकीच्या मेजवान्या बंद असतात. अंत:करणाच्या पोषणाच्या निमित्ताने तीन दिवसीय मिशनचे आयोजन करण्यात आले होते. पुण्याच्या पेपल सेमिनरीतील कॅप्युचिन धर्मगुरु फा. विल्सन डिसोजा यांनी ॲनिमेशनद्वारा लोकांना तीन दिवसांत तीन विविध विषयांवर मार्गदर्शन केले. पहिल्या दिवशी 'देव हा आपला आदर्श' दुसऱ्या दिवशी 'खिस्ताची ओळख' व तिसऱ्या दिवशी 'आपलं कुटुंब जीवंत की मृतप्राय' या विषयांवर प्रबोधन केले.

पहिल्या दिवशीच्या प्रवचनामध्ये फादरांनी देवाविषयीच्या काही अनैसर्गिक प्रतिमांची ओळख क रुन दिली व आपल्या देवाविषयीच्या संकल्पना कशा चुकीच्या आहेत यावर बोट ठेवले. दुसऱ्या दिवशी ख्रिस्ताविषयीची ओळख करुन देताना ख्रिस्ताला आपण कशा प्रकारे समजून घेतलेलं आहे हे उदाहरणासहित स्पष्ट करुन सांगितलं.

तिसऱ्या दिवशी कुटुंबाविषयी सांगताना पोप फ्रान्सिस यांच्या कुटुंबासाठी आवश्यक अशा चतुःसुत्रीचा वापर म्हणजे 'क्षमा करणे', 'विसरुन जा', 'आभार माना' व 'मला तुझी गरज आहे' या गोष्टी प्रत्येक सदस्याने वापरव्यात जेणेकरुन आपलं कुटुंब हे सदैव खेळकर वृत्तीचे दिसून येईल.
